Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday and one of our Catholic customs on Friday's during Lent is to pray the Stations of the Cross as a community. I would again like to offer to the various groups and ministries in our parish community the opportunity to lead an evening of Stations of the Cross this year. You can use whichever format you like or the standard one we've used in years past. A little internet search will uncover many options as well.

The Fridays that are available include: (beginning at 7pm) February 16, 23, March 2, 9, 16, 23, 30\* (\*at 3pm) Let Lisa Smith in the front office know which date and format your group would like: (206) 283-1456.

Ash Wednesday, February 14, and Good Friday, March 30, are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter. (Code of Canon Law, 1249-1252)

Fasting is to be observed by all eighteen years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their sixtieth birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all fourteen years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.







**Beginning Saturday, March 3rd, we will implement some changes  
to Communion locations.**

There will be four stations for the Precious Body of Christ.

Those wishing to receive the Precious Blood of Christ will have two stations—one on each side of the Sanctuary—near the Tabernacle and the other near the organ.

If receiving from the chalice, please process in the direction of the red arrows on the diagram and proceed around the congregation before returning to your pew.

Ushers will be present to direct the flow of the procession.

Those unable to process will receive the Precious Body from a roving minister. This change to two cups from four is due to too few Eucharistic Minister volunteers.
